MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2023 Lenten Penance and the Synodal Journey

Dear brothers and sisters!

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke all recount the episode of the Transfiguration of Jesus. There we see the Lord's response to the failure of his disciples to understand him. Shortlybefore, there had been a real

clash between the Master and Simon Peter, who, after professing hisfaith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God, rejected his prediction of the passion and the cross. Jesus had firmly rebuked him: "Get behind me, Satan! You are a scandal to me, because you donot think according to God, but according to men!" (*Mt* 16:23). Following this, "six days later, Jesus took with him Peter, James and John his brother and led them away to a high mountain" (*Mt*17:1). The Gospel of the Transfiguration is proclaimed every year on the Second Sunday of Lent. During this liturgical season, the Lord takes us with him to a place apart. While our ordinary commitments compel us to remain in our usual places and our often repetitive and sometimes boring routines, during Lent we are invited to ascend "a high mountain" in the company of Jesus and to live a particular experience of spiritual discipline– *ascesis* –as God's holypeople.

Lenten penance is a commitment, sustained by grace, to overcoming our lack of faith and our resistance to following Jesus on the way of the cross. This is precisely what Peter and the other disciples needed to do. To deepen our knowledge of the Master, to fully understand and embracethe mystery of his salvation, accomplished in total self-giving inspired by love, we must allow ourselves to be taken aside by him and to detach ourselves from mediocrity and vanity. We needto set out on the journey, an uphill path that, like a mountain trek, requires effort, sacrifice and concentration. These requisites are also important for the synodal journey to which,

as a Church, we are committed to making. We can benefit greatly from reflecting on the relationship between Lentenpenance and the synodal experience.

In his "retreat" on Mount Tabor, Jesus takes with him three disciples, chosen to bewitnesses of a unique event. He wants that experience of grace to be shared, not solitary, just as our whole life of faith is an experience that is shared.

For it is in togetherness that we follow Jesus. Together too, as a pilgrim Church in time, we experience the liturgical year and Lent within it, walking along side those whom the Lord has placed among us as fellow travellers. Like the a scent of Jesus and the disciples to Mount Tabor, we can say that our Lenten journey is "synodal", since we make it together along the samepath, as disciples of the one Master. For we know that Jesus is himself the Way, and therefore, both in the liturgical journey and in the journey of the Synod, the Church does nothing other than enter ever more deeply and fully into the mystery of Christ the Saviour.

And so we come to its culmination. The Gospel relates that Jesus" was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light" (Mt 17:2). This is the" summit", the goal of the journey. At the end of their as cent, as they stand on the mountain heights with Jesus, the three disciples are given the grace of seeing him in his glory, resplendent in supernatural light. That light did not come from without, but radiated from the Lord himself. The divine beauty of this vision was in comparably greater than all the efforts the disciples had made the ascent of Tabor. During any strenuous mountain trek, we must keep our eyes firmly fixed on the path; yet the panorama that opens up at the end amazes us and rewards us by its grandeur. So too, the synodal process may often seem arduous, and at times we may become discouraged. Yet what awaits us at the end is undoubtedly something wondrous and amazing, which will helpusto understand better God's will and our mission in the service of his kingdom.

The disciples' experience on Mount Tabor was further enriched when, alongside the transfigured Jesus, Moses and Elijah appeared, signifying respectively the Law and the Prophets(cf.*Mt*17:3). The newness of Christis at the sametime the fulfilment of the ancient covenant and promises; it is inseparable from God's history with his people and discloses its deeper meaning. In a similar way, the synodal journey is rooted in the Church's tradition and at the same time open to newness. Tradition is a source of inspiration for seeking newpaths and for avoiding the opposed temptations of immobility and improvised experimentation.

The Lenten journey of penance and the journey of the Synod alike have as their goal atransfiguration, both personal and ecclesial. A transformation that, in both cases, has its model in the Transfiguration of Jesus and is achieved by the grace of his paschal mystery. So that this transfiguration may become a reality in us this

year, I would like to propose two "paths" to follow in order to ascend the mountain together with Jesus and, with him, to attain the goal.

The first path has to do with the command that God the Father addresses to the disciples on Mount Tabor as they contemplate Jesus transfigured. The voice from the cloud says: "Listen to him" (*Mt* 17:5). The first proposal, then, is very clear: we need to listen to Jesus. Lent is a time of grace to the extent that we listen to him as he speaks to us. And how does he speak to us? First, in the word of God, which the Church offers us in the liturgy. May that word not fall on deafears; if we cannot always attend Mass, let us study its daily biblical readings, even with the help of theinternet. In addition to the Scriptures, the Lord speaks to us through our brothers and sisters, especially in the faces and the stories of those who are in need. Let me say something else, whichis quite important for the synodal process: listening to Christ often takes place in listening to ourbrothers and sisters in the Church. Such mutual listening in some phases is the primary goal, butitremains always indispensablein themethod and style of asynodal Church.

On hearing the Father's voice, the disciples" fell prostrate and we revery much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Rise, and do not be afraid.' And when the disciples raisedtheir eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone" (*Mt* 17:6-8). Here is the second proposal for this Lent: do not take refugeinare ligiosity made up of extraordinary events and dramatic experiences,out of fear of facing reality and its daily struggles, its hardships and contradictions. The light that Jesus shows the disciples is an anticipation of Easter glory, and that must be the goal of our ownjourney, as we follow "him alone".Lent leads to Easter: the "retreat" is not an end in itself, but ameans of preparing us to experience the Lord's passion and cross with faith, hope and love, andthus to arrive at the resurrection. Also on the synodal journey, when God gives us the grace of certain powerful experiences of communion, we should not imagine that we have arrived – forthere too, the Lord repeats to us: "Rise, and do not be afraid". Let us go down, then, to the plain, and may the grace we have experienced streng then us to be" art is ans of synodality" in the ordinary life of our communities.

Dear brothers and sisters, may the Holy Spirit inspire and sustain us this Lentin our as cent with Jesus, so that we may experience his divine splend our and thus, confirmed in faith, persevere in our journey together with him, glory of his people and light of the nations.

Archbishop's Message



The principal occupation of Christ's faithful and His priestly ministry in His one Catholic Church during Lent, is to learn and become educated in the truth and practice of the baptismal promises so as to be able to renew and profess them truthfully and conscientiously during the Easter vigil, For, the Son our Lord Jesus Christ established the mission of His Holy Spirit in the 'inner nature' of the person being baptized, as the Paraclete promised by His Eternal Father (Ezekiel 36:26-27) and as 'the Spirit of Truth' who will lead the baptised person to worship His Eternal Father 'in spirit and truth,' strictly on condition that he or she will habitually fulfilhis or her baptismal promises. The day the baptized person wilfully ignores his or her baptismal promise 'to renounce the Devil and his empty promises' and 'believe in the commandments and promises of the Eternal Father for our everlasting life of holiness, immortality and glory with Him, that day the mission of the Spirit of Truth diminishes in him or her and the nascent development of the baptized prison's communion with the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit tragically ebbs away. Then begins, the dismal history of that person's 'communion with the Devil' through his or her unimpeded journey of faith and hope in the empty promises of the Devil, seeking for happiness, greatness and glory in the fulfilment of 'the lust of the eyes, the lust of the flesh and the pride of life' in the Devil's *organised* human world of sin and death. It is only by re-educating oneself in the truth of one's baptismal promise that one can *retreat* from one's journey to everlasting damnation and seriously *advance* in the narrow path of salvation revealed to all human persons by the earthly journey of God's only begotten Son in His human nature to bring it to inherit the immortality and glory of His divine Sonship and enjoy it at the right hand of His Eternal Father. This grace is offered by Him to all of us during the Lenten season everyday: 'Repent and believe in the gospel and be saved. If today you hear My voice harden not your hearts.' In fact, meditation and reeducation and reorganization of one's daily personal life in accordance with one's baptismal promises to our Lord and to His Eternal Father is a necessary condition for receiving God's forgiving gift of the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of reconciliation.

St. Paul teaches us the truth and demands of our baptismal promises in a most profound manner when he declares: 'Do you not know that all of us who have been

baptised into Christ Iesus were baptized into His death?' What personal needs in His human nature was Jesus despising and what personal need in it was He striving to fulfil in freely undergoing that death at the command of His Eternal Father? When any person dies, his corporeal or bodily needs and his psychological needs for his personal life in the world of creatures disappear. Only the need in the 'inner nature' of the corporate human nature for the sublime bliss of everlasting communion and immortal bodily life with the Eternal Father remains. The Son was always busy with this need of His human nature all His earthly life and uncompromisingly despised the psychological needs created by the Devil and it angels for perpetual happy life in the world of creatures ('kingdom of the world') and sought the eschatological fulfilment of this 'inner need' through His unfailing obedience of faith to His Eternal Father unto death on the Cross and obtained it through His bodily resurrection from the dead in the Holy Spirit 'by the glory of the Father'. Likewise the baptized person is said to have been buried into Christ's death to the extent he or she habitually despises the same threefold psychological needs that Christ despised and concentrate on growing in the Father's favour for the eschatological fulfilment of that same need in the inner nature of his or her corporate human nature. To do so, St Paul advises us "the appointed time has grown very short; from now on, let those who have wives live as though they had none, and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no goods and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the form of this world is passing away (1 Cor.7:29-31).' And St. John confirms this teaching in his first epistle: 'Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the eyes, the lust of the flesh and the pride of life is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passes away and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides for ever (1 Jn.2:15-17).

ST. JOSEPH SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Holy Father's words came during his General Audience in Paul VI Hall in his third edition of his lessons about the saint who is not quoted in the Bible but has a role of action as the Father of Jesus. Like Joseph, the Pope suggested everyone needs silence." Joseph's silence is not mutism, he is not taciturn; it is a silence full of listening, an industrious silence, a silence that brings out his great interiority," the Pope said. "'The Father spoke a word, and it was his Son', comments St John of the Cross, the Father said a word and it was his Son – 'and it always speaks in eternal silence, and in silence it must be heard by the soul'." How good it would be if each one of us, following the example of Saint Joseph, were able to recover this contemplative dimension of life, opened wide in



silence. But we all know from experience that it is not easy: silence frightens us a little, because it asks us to delve into ourselves and to confront the part of us that is true. And many people are afraid of silence, they have to speak, and speak, and speak, or listen to radio or television... but they cannot accept silence because they are afraid."The philosopher Pascal observed that "all the unhappiness of men arises from one single fact, that they cannot stay quietly in their own chamber".





1. POPE FRANCIS: ASHES REMIND US OF THE TRUTH ABOUT OURSELVES

Pope Francis reflects on the meaning of receiving ashes on our foreheads at the beginning of Lent, and during the Ash Wednesday Mass, invites us to "set out on the path of charity, prayer, and fasting." The rite of the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of the faithful – which takes place during the liturgy at the beginning of Lent – marks the beginning of our "return journey" to God, Pope Francis said during his homily for the Mass of Ash Wednesday. The Holy Father explained that the imposition of ashes is an exhortation both to return to the truth about ourselves, and to return to God and to our brothers and sisters. The Lord is God, we are the work of His hands. The ashes, he said, remind us of who we are, recalling the "essential truth of our lives: that the Lord alone is God and we are the work of His hands." Lent, then, becomes a time to remember that we rely on God, and at the same time "to drop the pretense of being self-sufficient."

Rebuilding relationships with God and others

The Pope then turned to a second step in the journey back to God: returning to God and to our brothers and sisters. By dropping every presumption of self-sufficiency, and all forms of idolatry of self, we can begin to learn that "life is a relationship we receive from God and our parents," and that we can always revive and renew our relationships "thanks to the Lord and those he puts at our side.""Lent, then, is a season of grace when we can rebuild our relationship with God and with others, opening our hearts in the silence of prayer and emerging from the fortress of our self-sufficiency."

The paths of charity, prayer, and fasting

Finally, in order to make this journey, Pope Francis reminds the faithful of the three great paths of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting, that are traditionally encouraged during Lent. The Pope noted, "Jesus warns us that rather than mere external rites, these must be actions expressing the renewal of our hearts." All too often, he warned, "our gestures and rites have no impact on our lives, but remain superficial." But he said, if we remain humbly in the sight of God, our "almsgiving, prayer, and fasting will not simply remain outward displays, but will express what we truly are: children of God, and brothers and sisters to one another." Pope Francis concluded his homily with the exhortation to "bow our heads, receive the ashes, and lighten our hearts," to set forth on the paths of charity, prayer, and fasting.

"Let us not neglect the grace of this holy season," he said, "But fix our gaze on the Cross and set out, responding generously to the powerful promptings of Lent""At the end of the journey, we will encounter with greater joy the Lord of life, who alone can raise us up from our ashes."


